**4.** The principal Act is amended by inserting immediately after section 22 the following new section:

**22A.** In relation to the statements required by paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of section 22(2) and, where appropriate, paragraph (i) of that section, the Accountant-General shall provide in each of the statements the

- (a) budgeted figures for the financial year; and
- (b) comparative actual figures for the previous financial year.".
