An Act to amend the *Cultural Industries Development Act, Act 2013-15* to reduce the rate applicable to the deductions that can be claimed in respect of income tax.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Barbados as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Cultural Industries Development* (Amendment) Act, 2015.

Amendment of section 28 of Act 2013-15

2. Section 28 of the Cultural Industries Development Act (Act 2013-15), in this Act referred to as the principal Act, is amended, in subsection (1), by deleting the words "150 per cent" and substituting the words "100 per cent".
