TRAFFIC CONTROL (INDEPENDENCE SERVICE) RULES, 2011

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Independence Service) Rules*, 2011.
 - 2. In these Rules,

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Sunday, 27th November, 2011;

- "vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road* Cap. 295.

 Traffic Act.
- 3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Independence Service will be held in Independence Square in the parish of Saint Michael.

[&]quot;relevant period" means between 15:00 hours to 20:00 hours;

- 4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Fairchild Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Lower Bay Street in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.
- 5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Charles Duncan O'Neal Bridge in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.
- 6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no vehicles shall be allowed to park or remain stationary along Lower Bay Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Cavans Lane in the parish of Saint Michael except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.
- 7. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Bay Street from its junction with Jemmotts Lane to its junction with Probyn Street in the parish of Saint Michael shall be a one way street and traffic shall flow towards Upper Bay Street.
- 8. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, vehicles shall be allowed to travel in both directions along Lower Bay Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Cavans Lane in the parish of Saint Michael.
- 9. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 6 months.
- 10. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any ambulance service.
