TRAFFIC CONTROL (SANDY LANE GOLD CUP)
RULES, 2011

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Sandy Lane Gold Cup) Rules, 2011*.

2. In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) The Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 5th March, 2011;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*. Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date between 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours, Bush Hill Road in the parish of Saint Michael, from its junction with Garrison Road, shall be a one way street and all traffic shall proceed in an easterly direction and shall keep the Garrison Savannah on its right.

4. On the relevant date between 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours, Garrison Road in the parish of Saint Michael, from its junction with Garrison Hill to its junction with Highway 7 shall be a one way street and all traffic, except public service vehicles, shall proceed in a southerly direction and shall keep the Garrison Savannah on its right.

5. On the relevant date between 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours, the road west of the Garrison Road in the parish of Saint Michael, from its junction with Garrison Hill to its junction with Bush Hill shall be a one way street and all traffic, except public service vehicles, shall proceed in a southerly direction and shall keep the Garrison Savannah on its right.

6. On the relevant date between 07:00 hours and 19:00 hours, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Bush Hill;
- (b) Garrison Hill Road;
- (c) Garrison Road; and
- (d) the road which is west of the Garrison Savannah.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 3, 4, 5 and 6 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 6 months.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service, or any emergency vehicle.
