## Police Act Cap. 167

## TRAFFIC CONTROL (OISTINS FISH FESTIVAL) RULES, 2011

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Oistins Fish Festival) Rules*, 2011.
  - 2. In these Rules,

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic* Cap. 295. Act.

- 3. On Saturday 23rd April, Sunday 24th April and Monday 25th April, 2011, the Oistins Fish Festival will take place at Oistins in the parish of Christ Church.
- 4. On Saturday 23rd April and Monday 25th April, 2011 from 13:00 hours to 23:30 hours Oistins Road from its junction with Cane Vale Road to its junction with Keizer Hill in the parish of Christ Church shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

- 5. On Sunday 24th April, 2011 from 16:00 hours to 23:30 hours Oistins Road from its junction with Cane Vale Road to its junction with Keizer Hill in the parish of Christ Church shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.
- **6.** On Saturday 23rd April and Monday 25th April, 2011 from 13:00 hours to 23:30 hours and on Sunday 24th April, 2011 from 16:00 hours to 23:30 hours, no person shall park along:
  - (a) Cane Vale Road;
  - (b) Maxwell Hill Road;
  - (c) Cane Vale Crescent Road;
  - (d) Church Hill Road;
  - (e) Gall Hill Road;
  - (f) Lodge Road;
  - (g) Keizer Hill Road;
  - (h) Enterprise Road; and
  - (i) Oistins Road

in the parish of Christ Church.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraph 6 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

- **8.** Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.
- 9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service, or to any emergency vehicle.
