**TRAFFIC CONTROL (OISTINS FISH FESTIVAL FLOAT
PARADE) RULES, 2011**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Oistins Fish Festival Float Parade) Rules, 2011*.

2. In these Rules,

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Monday 25th April, 2011;

"relevant period" means from 15:00 hours until 17:00 hours;

"route" means Dover Road, Maxwell Main Road, Welches Road and Oistins Road in the parish of Christ Church;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*. Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date the Oistins Fish Festival Float Parade will take place along the route.

4. On the relevant date during the relevant period the route shall be closed to all vehicular traffic, except motor omnibuses, route-taxis and minibuses.

5. On the relevant date during the relevant period no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purposes of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Dover Road;
- (b) Maxwell Main Road;
- (c) Welches Road; and
- (d) Oistins Road

in the parish of Christ Church.

6. Drivers or riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads on the route shall comply with these Rules and with any direction given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

7. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

8. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service, or to any emergency vehicle.
