TRAFFIC CONTROL (JUNIOR KADOOMENT)
RULES, 2011

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Junior Kadooment) Rules, 2011*.

2. In these Rules,

"band" means any group of persons organised as a costume band by the Crop Over Festival Committee and approved by the Minister responsible for Family, Culture, Sports and Youth to participate in the Junior Kadooment Parade;

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Saturday 23rd July, 2011;

"route" means Spooner's Hill Road, Codrington Hill Road and through the Nova Scotia Gate at the National Stadium in the parish of Saint Michael;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*. Cap. 295

3. On the relevant date, between 8:00 hours and 12:00 hours, bands may parade only along the route starting at the Lawrence T. Gay Memorial School and ending at the National Stadium in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. (1) On the relevant date between 8:00 hours and 12:00 hours,

(a) Spooner's Hill Road from its junction with Pioneer Road to its junction with Codrington Road; and

(b) Codrington Road to its junction with Bush Hall Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except those vehicles used by members of the Crop Over Festival Committee of the Ministry responsible for Family, Culture, Sports and Youth.

(2) No person shall drive along, park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on a road specified in sub-paragraph (1) except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

5. On the relevant date, between 8:00 hours and 18:00 hours, vehicles travelling along Stadium Road from its junction with Codrington Road to its junction with Bush Hall Main Road in the parish of Saint Michael shall travel in the direction of Bush Hall Main Road only.

6. On the relevant date, between 8:00 hours and 18:00 hours, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

(a) Codrington Road;

(b) Bush Hall Main Road;

(c) Waterford Road;

- (d) Spooner's Hill Road;
- (e) Bow Road;
- (f) Bush Hall Yard Gap; or
- (g) Butler's Avenue,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500.00 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
