DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, 1984

- 1. These directions may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Vaucluse Raceway Motor Sport Club, Rally) Directions, 2011.*
 - 2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period:

On Saturday July 23, 2011

- (a) Between the hours of 12.00 noon and 12.00 midnight in the parish of Saint Thomas, the section of road known as Hangman's Hill, commencing from the junction with Hopewell (Highway 2), proceeding in a westerly direction on the said Hangman's Hill, continuing in a northerly direction on Dukes and Canefield Roads, proceeding in a westerly direction on the Canefield Road and finishing at the junction with Dunscombe Road.
- (b) Between the hours of 12.00 noon and 12.00 midnight in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as Fourhill Road, commencing from the junction with Indian Ground Road, proceeding in a westerly and northerly direction on the said Fourhill Road, continuing in an easterly direction on the Orange Hill Road, proceeding in a northerly direction on French Village Road and finishing five hundred metres before the junction at French Village and Applegrove Roads.

- (c) Between the hours of 12.00 noon and 12.00 midnight in the parish of Saint Lucy, the section of road known as Cottage Road, proceeding in a westerly direction on the said Cottage Road, continuing in a north easterly direction on Pickerings Road and Spring Hall Road, proceeding in a north westerly direction on Hope Road and finishing at the junction with Greenidges and Bright Hall Roads.
- 3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform, commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.
- 4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
