TRAFFIC CONTROL (GRAND KADOOMENT)
RULES, 2011

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Grand Kadooment) Rules, 2011*.

2. In these Rules,

"band" means any group of persons organised as a costumed band by the Crop Over Festival Committee and approved by the Minister responsible for Family, Culture, Sports and Youth to participate in the Grand Kadooment Parade;

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"Festival Committee" means the Crop Over Festival Committee of the Ministry responsible for Family, Culture, Sports and Youth;

"relevant date" means Monday, 1st August, 2011;

"route" means Warrens, Green Hill Road, Codrington Road, Waterford Road, Station Hill Road, Bank Hall Cross Road, Bank Hall Main Road, Eagle Hall, Black Rock Main Road, Brighton Road and the Spring Garden Highway in the parish of Saint Michael.

Cap. 295. “vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*.

3. On the relevant date, between 07:00 hours and 18:00 hours, bands may parade only along the route, commencing at Warrens and proceeding along the route to the Spring Garden Highway.

4. On the relevant date, between 07:00 hours and 18:00 hours, Codrington Road from its junction with Waterford Road to its junction with Waterford Bottom Road, in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.

5. On the relevant date, between 07:00 hours and 18:00 hours, the following roads shall be closed to all vehicular traffic, except in respect of vehicles used in the Kadooment Day Parade and vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee:

- (a) Station Hill Road;
- (b) Bank Hall Cross Road;
- (c) Bank Hall Main Road;
- (d) Eagle Hall;
- (e) President Kennedy Drive;
- (f) Fontabelle Road;
- (g) Redman Road;
- (h) Princess Alice Highway;
- (i) Prescod Boulevard;
- (j) Holborn Circle; and
- (k) Spring Garden Highway,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. On the relevant date, between 06:00 hours and 22:00 hours, Spring Garden Highway from its junction with Holborn Circle to its junction with Black Rock Road in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except vehicles used in the Kadooment Day Parade and vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.

7. Subject to paragraphs 8, 9 and 10, on the relevant date, between 06:00 hours and 20:00 hours, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall drive along, park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on the route.

8. On the relevant date, between 06:00 hours and 18:00 hours, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall drive along, park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along Stadium Road in the parish of Saint Michael, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

9. On the relevant date, between 06:00 hours and 22:00 hours, no person in charge of a vehicle shall drive along, park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on Brighton Road from its junction with Black Rock Main Road to its junction with Spring Garden Highway in the parish of Saint Michael, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

10. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 7, 8 and 9 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any other order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

11. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

12. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
