### **CHAPTER 400**

### **CENTENNIAL HONOUR**

An Act to provide for the conferment of "the Centennial Honour" on 2000-14. persons who have contributed to the building of the nation of 2000-28. Barbados and in respect of whom there has been no conferment of any National or Imperial Honour for that contribution, and for related matters.

[28th August, 2000] Commence-

**1.** This Act may be cited as the *Centennial Honour Act*.

Short title.

2. In this Act "Centennial Honour" means the honour of that Interpretaname established by section 3.

3. There is established an honour entitled the Centennial Honour. Establish-

Centennial Honour.

4. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the Governor-General may by Conferment instrument under Public Seal confer the Centennial Honour upon a of the Centennial person referred to in section 5.

Honour.

- (2) The power conferred on the Governor-General by subsection (1) shall be exercised by him on the advice of the Prime Minister.
- (3) A conferment of the Centennial Honour shall take effect from the date of the affixing of the Public Seal or from such other date as may be specified in the instrument.
  - 5. A person who

Eligibility forcon-

(a) has been nominated for the honour by Barbadians living in Barbados or elsewhere:

ferment of Centennial Honour.

- (b) was born in Barbados or is a citizen of Barbados or is entitled to be registered as a citizen of Barbados;
- (c) has made an outstanding contribution to national or community life; and
- (d) has not been awarded any National or Imperial Honour,

is eligible for the conferment of the Centennial Honour.

Publication.

**6.** The Prime Minister shall by order published in the *Official Gazette*, publish the names of those persons upon whom the Centennial Honour is conferred.

Post nominals and insignia. 2000-28.

- **7.** (1) Every person upon whom the Centennial Honour has been conferred is entitled
  - (a) to have the letters "B.C.H." placed after his name on all occasions when the use of letters after a name is customary; and
  - (b) to wear as a decoration the prescribed insignia for holders of the Centennial Honour.
- (2) For the purpose of this section the letters "B.C.H." mean Barbados Centennial Honour.
