### CHAPTER 49

### PRINCESS ROYAL SCHOLARSHIP

An Act to authorise the establishment of The Princess Royal Scholarship. 1960-35.

L.N. 168/ 1967.

[22nd December, 1960] Commence-

- 1. This Act may be cited as The Princess Royal Scholarship Short title.
  - 2. For the purposes of this Act, the expression—

Interpretation.

- "Princess Royal Scholar" means the holder of the scholarship;
- "Scholarship" means the Princess Royal Scholarship established by section 3.
- 3. (1) Notwithstanding the Local Government Act, the Interim Com-Interim Commissioner for Local Government is hereby missioner to raise authorised and empowered to apply from time to time a sum moneys for not exceeding two thousand dollars of the moneys raised by the Cap. 107. making and levying of the general rate and trade tax in each and every year in respect of the City of Bridgetown.

- (2) The sums so raised shall yearly be paid over by the Interim Commissioner to the Accountant-General, for the provision of one Scholarship to the University of the West Indies to be known as "The Princess Royal Scholarship".
- 4. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the Scholarship shall be Scholarship tenable at the University of the West Indies for a period of University three years on the terms and conditions provided by regulations. of the West Indies.

(2) Where the Princess Royal Scholar, with the approval of the Interim Commissioner for Local Government, undertakes a course of study requiring attendance at the University of the

West Indies for a period exceeding three years, the Scholarship shall be tenable for such further period as may be approved by the Interim Commissioner for the purpose of enabling the Princess Royal Scholar to complete his studies, on the terms and conditions provided by regulations:

Provided that the total period of tenure of the Scholarship shall not in any case exceed four years.

(3) For the purposes of this section the expression "course of study" includes such post-graduate study as may be approved by the Interim Commissioner.

Conditions of Scholarship.

5. Subject to subsection (2), the Scholarship shall be awarded on the results of the entrance examination held by the University of the West Indies only to persons of the following classes—

- (a) citizens of Barbados whose parents or guardians or one of them are or is resident in the City of Bridgetown;
- (b) children whose parents or one of them are or is a citizen of Barbados and whose parents or guardians or one of them are or is resident in the City of Bridgetown;
- (c) children of parents who are domiciled in this Island and whose parents or guardians or one of them have or has resided in the City of Bridgetown for a period of not less than six years.
- (2) The Scholarship shall not be awarded to any person unless he or she has been receiving his or her respective education in this Island for a period of not less than three years during the preceding five years previous to the date of the award, nor to any candidate unless such candidate has attained the standard prescribed by the regulations.

Termination of Scholarship.

**6.** During the period of tenure of the Scholarship, the Scholarship shall not be terminated otherwise than in accordance with the regulations.

Regulations. L.N. 168/ 1967. 7. The Chief Education Officer shall, after consultation with the Board of Education and with the approval of the Minister responsible for Education, make regulations for giving effect to this Act.

8. Nothing in this Act declared or expressed shall affect the rights of the Crown, all bodies politic and corporate, and all others except such as are mentioned in this Act and those claiming by, from, and under them.
