SALE OF TOBACCO

An Act to regulate the sale of tobacco.

1908-10.

[19th August, 1908]

Commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the Sale of Tobacco Act.

Short title.

2. For the purposes of this Act, the expression—

Interpretation.

"tobacco" includes manufactured tobacco and cigars of every description but does not include cigarettes rolled in paper.

3. (1) Any person who hawks or sells or offers for sale any Tobacco not tobacco in or about the streets or highways or in any house or in streets or premises, except if he is the owner or occupant of such house sold in any or premises, shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars to be seller be recovered in a summary manner before a magistrate on the owner or occupier. information of any person.

to be hawked

- (2) Such a person may be arrested by any Inland Revenue officer, Customs officer or constable and taken to the police station of the district and any tobacco in his possession shall be seized, forfeited and sold.
- (3) This section shall not apply to any person employed to travel for orders by any manufacturer of or dealer in tobacco and producing samples in the due and ordinary course of business.
- (4) The onus of proof that he is a person exempted from the operation of this section shall be on the defendant in any prosecution.
- 4. One-half of all penalties and of the proceeds of the sale Application of penalties of all forfeited tobacco shall be paid to the informant.
