CHAPTER 398

WILD BIRDS PROTECTION

An Act relating to the protection of certain wild birds.

Commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection Act.

Short title.

2. For the purposes of this Part, the expression "wild bird" means any bird specified in the Schedule.

Any person who knowingly kills or wounds or attempts to Killing or kill or wound a wild bird shall be liable to a penalty of \$100 for each wild bird killed or wounded or attempted to be killed or wounded, 1978-27. to be recovered in a summary manner before a magistrate on the information of any person and paid one-half to the informant.

The skin and feathers of any wild bird are hereby prohibited to be exported from Barbados.

(2) Where any skin or feathers of any wild bird are exported, the person who exports such skin or feathers shall be liable to a penalty of \$250, to be recovered in the manner and by the person specified in, and to be distributed as is provided by, section 4.

Licence for killing wild birds for purposes of natural history. L.N. 168/ 1967. 6. Any person desiring to obtain specimens of any wild birds for the purposes of natural history shall be entitled to kill the same for such purposes on obtaining a licence to do so from the Minister.
